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

Policy Updates

w.r.t SEZ ACT

- 1. RULE 41 of SEZ Rules does not allow diamonds having duty to be taken outside SEZ for sub-contracting
- 2. There is no provision to send diamonds from SEZ to Special Notified Zone(SNZ) established by the Government of India at Bharat Diamond Bourse, BKC, Mumbai to facilitate imports and trading of rough diamonds in India.
- 3. Problems faced by SEEPZ manufacturers regarding Transfer of Property
- 4. Request for adding "precious metal" in the notification
- 5. All Industry Rate (AIR) to be fixed for SEZ Units to avail Duty Drawback against precious metal supplies received from DTA
- 6. SEZ units to be allowed for taking Diamonds & Stones on consignment from DTA at Jaipur
- 7. Transfer of precious metal from SEZ to EOUs, Including Silver or Rubber moulds for transfer purpose
- 8. Return of non-usable/ rejected pieces of stones
- 9. Procurement of 'cut and polished diamonds' from Domestic Tariff Area to SEEPZ-SEZ as 'Bill to Ship to' consignments
- 10. Penalties should be based on the amount of default

Policy Updates E-

Commerce


Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) has come up with The Courier Imports and Exports (Electronic Declaration and Processing) Regulations, 2010 which has been suitably amended vide Notification No.57/2022-Customs (N.T.) dated 30.06.2022 and it now incorporates a re-import process for returns of jewellery.

In continuation, CBIC vide Circular No. 09/2022-Customs dated 30th June, 2022 has released the Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for the facilitation of export of jewellery through e- commerce through courier mode. The jewellery exported through the e-commerce can be executed under CTH 7113 (excluding parts of jewellery falling under CTSH 71131190 and CTSH 71131960) and imitation jewellery falling under CTH 7117 of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff Act, 1975.

The SOP has been briefed under following heads:

- Electronic Declaration on ECCS and Uploading of documents.
- Producing the goods at the ICT for exports
- Customs Assessment and Examination.
- Clearance for exports
- Procedure for re-import of returned jewellery items
- Provision of infrastructure at an ICT for secure handling and movement of jewellery consignment.
- Provision of enabling environment by Customs Field Formations.



Introduction to IJPM

India Jewellery Park Mumbai (IJPM) is GJEPC's ambitious project to provide state-of-the-art facilities to manufacturers and bring entire Jewellery manufacturing ecosystem under one roof. The project is envisaged to house more than 1000 Gems and Jewellery units on 21.3-acre plot of land.

Building A



- Block A is "State of the art" manufacturing facility for Large and Medium manufacturers
- > Industrial units from **2,672** sq. ft. to **5,273** sq. ft. carpet area with total of **23** Lac+ area available
- > This block will have 9 interconnected buildings of ground + **14** floors

Building B



- Block B is manufacturing facility for Small Unit Holders and Karigars
- Industrial units from **413** sq. ft. to **621** sq. ft. carpet area with total of **3 Lac**+ area available
- > This block will have one building of ground + 9 floors


